## Recycle and Compost Right During the Holidays

As the Halloween, Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays draw nearer, it's important to remember which materials are accepted as recycling and composting. Pumpkins are compostable, including the skin, meat, stem, guts, and even the seeds. If pumpkins are free of paint/dye, they can be placed in your green compost cart. It's important to remember not to place pumpkins in your gray recycling cart as they will be considered a contaminant and end up being landfilled. Recycle all foods scraps and food-soiled paper products in your green compost cart. Unwanted holiday tree lights should be safely recycled through a certified Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Facility. Visit StopWaste.org/HHW for information on Alameda County's free residential HHW Drop-off Program. Please review the accepted and prohibited materials section below so you can recycle and compost right during the holiday season!

## Holiday Tree Recycling

After all the presents have been opened, the lights and ornaments taken down, your holiday tree still has one more use it can fulfill. Turn it into compost! Tri-CED Community Recycling will collect holiday trees at no additional charge between December 26 and January 31, 2023.




On your regular collection day, simply set your tree at the curb or place inside the green compost cart. Trees will be taken to an organics recycling facility to be turned into beneficial mulch and compost!

# Please prepare your tree for collection by following these simple guidelines:

- Remove tree stands and all ornaments, tinsel, lights, etc.
- Trees taller than 6 feet should be cut in half.
- Place the tree at the curb next to your green compost cart before 6 a.m. on your regular service day.
- Natural trees only. No artificial or flocked trees.
- If you miss the citywide tree collection, you can put your tree in the green compost cart. Please cut the tree into pieces that will fit completely into the cart with the lid closed.

### **Tree Drop-off Location**

Another option for residents, including multi-family households, is to drop off your holiday tree at Tri-CED Community Recycling. Trees will be accepted at no additional cost through the end of January.
