Bulky item collection may be requested by your community property manager for an additional fee to collect any large items that are too heavy to lift or do not fit in the landfill containers. Alternatively, the Property Manager may request an open-top debris box for community organized clean-up events for the associated container collection rate. ✓ ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Large Appliances

One major household appliance per pickup (water heater, washing machine, dryer, etc.). For safety, tightly secure or remove doors/lids.

Electronic Waste

Computer monitors, CPUs, TVs, printers, VCR/DVD players, small appliances.

Yard Trimmings

Please tie in bundles no more than five feet in length or six inches in diameter. Clean unpainted wood only. No fencing.

Furniture & Carpet

Including mattreses and box springs. Carpet must be rolled, tied and less than 4 ft long.

Tires

Maximum of four (4) passenger car tires or smaller

Other

Flattened and bundled cardboard scrap metal, etc. Loose items must be boxed or bagged.

ORGANICS REDUCTION AND RECYCLING LAW (SB 1383) IS NOW IN EFFECT

California's Senate Bill (SB) 1383 became law on January 1, 2022. This law requires all multi-family owners/managers to:

- Subscribe to recycle and compost collection services.
- Ensure recyclable, compostable, and landfill materials are sorted into the correct containers through periodic inspections and education.
- Place color-coded and labeled recycle and compost containers next to indoor landfill containers.
- Inform tenants no later than 14 days after move-in and at least 14 days prior to move-out about SB 1383 requirements.

Holiday Collection Schedule

Observed holidays include Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day. When these holidays fall on a weekday, your collection service will move by one day (e.g., Monday service moves to Tuesday, etc.).

Complimentary Waste Assessments

Republic Services and Tri-CED Community Recycling provide customized sharedcollection services. Contact your property manager to notify of overloaded bins/ carts or if additional collection service is needed. Your property manager can request a different-sized/additional collection container or increased service frequency at an additional cost. A dedicated recycling coordinator can conduct a free on-site waste assessment, recommend optimal service levels, and provide additional technical assistance. Don't have mandatory compost collection service at your community? Request this through your property manager!

Food Scraps Kitchen Pail and Recycle Tote Bag

Recycle Tote Bags and Food Scraps Kitchen Pails are available for every multifamily resident! Use your Recycle Tote Bag to separate and transport recyclables to the Recycle Bin/Cart. Use the Kitchen Pail to separate and transport all food scraps and food-soiled paper to the Compost Bin/Cart. Keep the Recycle Tote Bag and Kitchen Pail for reuse. You may line your Kitchen Pail with paper towels, newspaper, kraft paper, or BPI-certified compostable bags. Do not place food scraps in noncompostable bags.

Contact your property manager to request a Recycle Tote Bag or Kitchen Pail at no additional cost.



Annual Compost Giveaway Day

Union City residents can pick up two free bags of compost made from food scraps. food-soiled paper, and yard trimmings collected through the City's Compost Collection Program.

Holiday Tree Collection

Visit Tri-CED in Union City to drop off your holiday tree at no additional cost between December 26 through January 31. Trees over 6 feet long must be cut in half. Artificial/flocked trees and trees with tinsel, lights, or in plastic/metal stands will not be collected for recycling.

Recycling Buyback Center and Electronic Waste Drop-off

Tri-CED is a certified CA Redemption Center. Bring in aluminum cans, plastic and glass bottles and containers labeled with a CRV symbol for redemption and get paid. Select electronic waste such as batteries may also be dropped off for recycling at no additional cost.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Drop-Off

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) such as pesticides, solvents, pool chemicals, fluorescent lamps, medication, paints and treated wood require careful disposal by a facility certified to handle these materials. It is illegal to place HHW in any Recycle, Compost, or Landfill Bin/ Cart. Safely dispose of these items for free at an Alameda County HHW Drop-off Facility or County-sponsored events throughout the year.
